Who: College/university undergraduate or graduate students interested in attending the Western Users of SAS® Software (WUSS) 2018 Conference and meeting each of the following four criteria:

1. Enrolled in an undergraduate or graduate degree program during the 2018–2019 academic year at an accredited degree-granting institution in the WUSS region (Alaska, Arizona, California, Colorado, Hawaii, Idaho, Montana, Nevada, Oregon, Utah, Washington, and Wyoming)
2. Able to provide proof of enrollment (via copies of class schedule or official enrollment confirmation letter) and a copy of current student identification card
3. Willing to volunteer as a session or class coordinator (this requires a 4-hour commitment, with details provided to scholarship awardees)
4. Have been awarded a WUSS student scholarship at most once before, and will be presenting a paper or poster at WUSS 2018 if applying to receive a second student scholarship¹

What: Scholarship awardees will receive complimentary conference registration, discounted lodging, and one free half-day class (Wed AM or Fri PM)

Where and When: September 5–7, 2018, at the Hyatt Regency in Sacramento, California

How: Submit a presentation abstract by **May 18, 2018** at <http://wuss18.org/presenter-resources/> (if applying to receive a second student scholarship) and a scholarship application by **June 22, 2018**² at <http://wuss18.org/student-scholarships/>
